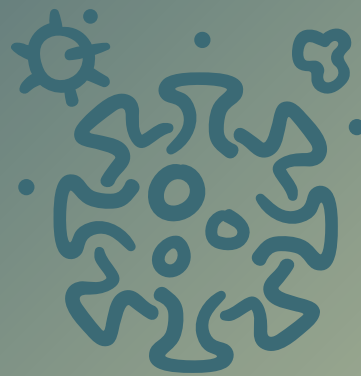

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHEN CAN I RECEIVE THE VACCINE?

Chisago County Public Health administers the Moderna Vaccine which is currently made available to all Chisago County residents aged 18 years and older. Residents aged 16-17 years of age should check with their health care provider to receive the vaccine.

WILL I HAVE TO PAY FOR THE VACCINE?

All COVID-19 vaccines are free. If you choose to get the vaccine through your local health care provider, then you may have to pay administration fees. This means that you might be asked for your insurance information when you get the COVID-19 vaccine through your health care provider.

IS THE VACCINE SAFE?

Yes. The COVID vaccine has gone through the same rigorous process for evaluating safety and effectiveness as all other vaccines approved for use by the FDA.

DO THE COVID VACCINES PROTECT AGAINST NEW VARIANTS?

We are still learning about new variants. While the COVID-19 vaccines may not work as well against some of the variant strains, scientists think the vaccines will still offer some protection against most COVID-19 variants.

WHAT IF I'VE ALREADY HAD COVID-19?

You should get vaccinated even if you have had COVID-19. We are not sure how long protection from a COVID-19 infection might last. If you have an opportunity to get vaccinated after you have had COVID-19, you can do so after you have completed your isolation period.

DO I STILL NEED TO WEAR A MASK AFTER I GET THE VACCINE?

Yes. Experts are still learning how the vaccine protects individuals under real-life conditions, so it's still important to continue to use all of the tools available to help stop the pandemic.
